L-T ADDITION PROJECT: NEW UPDATE!

L-T's admin was recently briefed by DCPS on the most recent news regarding the <u>addition project</u> first notified to the community last May. Principal Miller indicated that there appeared to be a whole new set of folks in charge of the project; not the people that we and she met last Spring. The highlights of the meeting that were relayed by Principal Miller were:

- The design-build contract has been awarded. (Google tells me it was <u>awarded</u> to Keystone Plus Construction Corporation at the beginning of December 2023 and the design is due by May 2024.)
- Despite previous indications, DCPS did not indicate that they plan any near-term consultations with the school community. We will push for a meeting on the design once it is received.
- Construction is expected to begin on a 3-story addition containing 6 new classrooms in October 2024.
- The administration requested that the current library be split back into two full-sized classrooms and two classrooms worth of space in the addition be converted into a new media center. DCPS is non-committal.
- The addition will be built on the site of the existing rain garden. DCPS is aware that the area serves a water retention/flood control purpose for the immediate neighborhood and claims they have a plan.
- DCPS says that the playground and garden will be unaffected by the addition and access to them will remain through-out construction, which is expected to be completed by beginning of school year '25-'26.



Please join us on Sunday January 28th from 2-3:45 pm at Canal Park for some outdoor ice skating! If you RSVP by Thursday January 18th <u>here</u>, the cost will be a discounted \$12.50 per person including skate rentals & the rink will source skates in the appropriate sizes to cover our RSVPs. If you would like to join but cost is a barrier, please still sign up! The PTO will cover the cost for any families who request it.

Note: You may be able to walk-up on the day without RSVPing & join our group, but that would be subject to space & skate availability and the internet tells me it may cost \$21 for adults or \$18 for children.

PANCAKES & LITERACY: POETRY COMPETITION RETURNS!



Any L-T student may enter any poem or poems of their choice! There is no limit on the number of poems that a student may enter. The poem(s) can be one written specially for this competition or it can be a poem they wrote previously. (However, students may NOT enter poems that they entered into last year's competition.)

Any poem entered in the competition must be substantially the work of the student entering it. Among other things, this means that students must write or type the poem(s) themselves in the first instance; they may not merely dictate a poem to an adult. An adult may assist with spelling, but should not otherwise be substantially editing a student's work.

For ECE only, instead of writing a poem, a student may enter a work of art that is somehow poetry or literacy related. The possibilities are endless! A picture inspired by a particular poem or that features the alphabet, for instance, would be directly on point.

HOW DO YOU ENTER?

The most preferred method of entry is to send the poem to <u>pto@ludlowtaylor.org</u>; you will receive an email confirming receipt. Students may submit a typed version of their poem or send a photo of the poem. Alternatively, poems may be dropped in the PTO mailbox or given to a classroom teacher. An adult may assist with the logistics of submitting poems, including with typing a handwritten poems (though we encourage grades 3+ to do their own typing).

WHO WINS?

Our esteemed panel of celebrity judges (i.e., teachers) will be awarding prizes in each of the ECE, K-1st, 2nd-3rd & 4th-5th age brackets. All judging will be blind & no teacher will judge their own students' work!

All winners, runners-up & honorable mentions will have their poems displayed in the school & receive medals during the Pancakes & Literacy event on Thursday February 22nd.
